Feedback and Discussion (Post-APS or ?)

- **Post-APS from #2 (1997) through #17 (2012)**
 - ★ deemed best way for foreign participation
 - ... but this interferes with those who teach
 - ... and if APS is followed by Thanksgiving, others unavailable
- **March interferes with U.S./Japan in Japan on alternate years**
 - ... and Spring breaks do not overlap at different universities!
- **May-June interferes with EPS preparation? But all universities end late May.**
 - ★ limits European participation? OK if late-May?
 - ... and U.S. and Japan who go to EPS? OK if late-May?
